

What are Youth Camping Grants?

The Lassen Park Foundation in partnership with Lassen Volcanic National Park provide grants to nonprofit youth organizations to facilitate camping trips for at-risk and underserved youth. By supporting outdoor learning and environmental education, the Foundation hopes to provide a catalyst for change in the lives of a new generation of national park stewards.

For the last twenty years the Foundation has funded up to one week of camping for over 2,000 young people.

WHAT IS THERE TO DO IN THE PARK?

Lassen Volcanic National Park is a spectacular landscape "born of fire and forged by ice". Lassen Peak, at 10,457 feet elevation, is one of the world's largest plug dome volcanoes. Youth groups can witness the rich diversity of plant and animal life by hiking nature trails, visiting hydrothermal sites, attending Ranger-Led talks, and even hiking to the heights of Lassen Peak. The park is home to alpine valleys, wildflower meadows, volcanic landforms, and breathtaking waterfalls.

For many of the kids, camping is the best part of the adventure! The group campsite has piped water and is close to a paved road, a small store, and coin-operated showers. Park Rangers are available for any questions or any emergency services.

WHAT IS THE LASSEN PARK FOUNDATION?

Grants are available!

Grants up to \$1,000 include funding for transportation, food, and equipment costs or rental. The group campsite at Crags Campground accommodates a maximum of 25 people -- up to 18 youth and 7 adults.

Deadline for Application Is May 1, 2015

<u>SUPERVISION</u> — Camping groups are responsible for the organization of the trip and must maintain their own supervision of youth. The foundation provides funds for camping supplies and transportation, but not for supervisory personnel. The Foundation will assist in coordination of plans with park personnel.

<u>Transportation</u> – Many activities are not within walking distances from the campsite. It is highly recommended to have transportation during the camping trip.
